Fish and Wildlife Service completed its National Fisheries Program Strategic Vision for the Future. That landmark document was developed in collaboration with partners from across the country, including the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF and G), to better define the Services role in conserving and managing the Nations aquatic resources. The Vision, because it is national in scope, outlines a number of broad goals and objectives that will focus the efforts of the National Program over two consecutive 5-year periods. Because the aquatic resources and the issues that threaten their status differ among the Services Regions, the priority of these goals and objectives likewise varies from one part of the nation to another. Alaska shares in many of the same aquatic habitat threats common among the Services Regions and is arguably Americas climate change ground zero with landscape level effects that are both immediate and visible. The direction outlined in this plan is based largely upon the strategic direction and the lessons we learned in implementing the 2004-2008 regional plan. We believe that...
